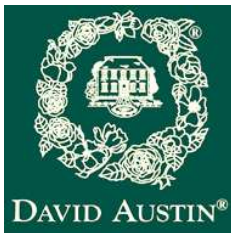

## REGULATIONS FOR SHOWS

1. Exhibitors and Judges must be current members of the The Rose Society UK.

2. In restricted classes, exhibitors may accept assistance with staging their blooms; however in open classes, they must stage their own blooms

3. Exhibitors should submit entries in writing or by email using the standard entry form supplied with this schedule or down-loadable on the society's website. Late entries will be permitted if space is available, but only if the exhibitor has already made entries prior to the relevant closing date

1. Exhibitors may only make one entry in each class unless otherwise permitted in the schedule. Spouses or partners living together are considered as one exhibitor
2. Star of the Show classes (at all shows - except virtual shows when only one entry is permitted) -
  - i) in these classes, exhibitors may make any number of entries but only one exhibit of any one variety in each class
  - ii) exhibitors are reminded that in these classes the roses are judged for bloom, stem and foliage
6. All exhibitors and helpers must leave the place in which the competition is taking place at the appointed time. Warnings will be given at intervals prior to the appointed time
7. Exhibits may not be removed from the show tables without prior permission from the Show Secretary
8. All blooms must have been grown by the exhibitor from bushes that have been in their possession for at least three months
9. Any objections regarding judging decisions must be before 12 noon on the day of judging with a deposit of £5 which will be forfeited if the decision is found to be frivolous by two or more members of the shows committee present at the show
10. To assist judging and to provide information for visitors, all exhibits, should be named. Incorrect, or not naming will not disqualify, providing there is no duplication in classes which ask for distinct varieties. Seedlings, Sports, or unknown varieties should be noted on the variety card provided
11. All rose blooms are to be exhibited free of artificial aids of any kind. The only exception is that Large Flowered booms may have a single wire inserted to hold the flower head erect. All stems must reach water, or water retaining material. Water retaining material in vases, bowls and containers must be kept below the rim of the vessel to allow watering during the show. Only foliage growing on stems is

allowed, except where stated in the schedule. Foliage must not be dressed with oils or any other agent

12. All rose blooms exhibited should conform to the standards set out in the current edition of 'Judging and Showing Roses.
13. All exhibits are to be staged for **frontal effect**, except miniature baskets or where otherwise stated in the schedule
14. All receptacles are provided for staging the rose blooms and should be used as stated in the schedule. Exhibits must be staged at the show venue during the time slot allowed in the schedule. The society receptacles must not be taken away for future use
15. The term 'Miniflora' when used in this schedule, describes blooms that are well above average sized miniature rose blooms. They should not be so large as to appear coarse and be markedly smaller than Large Flowered blooms. Stems and foliage should be in proportion to the bloom. All exhibits in classes defined as 'Miniflora' will be judged as defined in 7.5 and 7.6 of Judging and Showing Roses
16. The stems of all miniature cluster flowered roses may bear any type of bloom. It should be noted that all blooms should be shown at the perfect stage for the type of blooms entered. HT type should be half to three quarter open, single, double or semi double blooms should be open and have fresh stamens if visible. All other requirements will be judged and defined in 7.4 of Judging and Showing Roses. Judges should show no preference toward any individual type of bloom. Copies of 'Judging and Showing Roses' is available from the Society website and on the secretary's desk at all shows.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### 1. MISCELLANEOUS:

**Entry Fees.** No entry fees will be charged to fully paid up members of The Rose Society UK.

**Staging.** Times will vary between shows Please see details of staging times for specific shows. For virtual shows see page 6

**Containers.** All containers are supplied by the Society. No others may be used.

**Exhibitor's cards.** May be collected from the Secretary's table during the time the show is open for staging.

**Payment of prize money.** Prize money awarded at all shows during the year will be paid at the end of the year except classes that are sponsored with vouchers. Sponsored prizes will be available for collection immediately after award ceremonies.

**Premier Show medals** will be engraved with the winner's name and presented at the first suitable occasion

**Awards Presentations** will take place at 12.30pm midday on the first day of all shows. All exhibitors are requested to attend this presentation. Virtual Spring show –Winners will be published on the website w/c 23rd May 2021

## **2. POINTS VALUES IN CLASSES FOR ALL SHOWS ( not including virtual shows):**

All classes will carry a points value of;

**4 points for a first prize**

**2 points for a second prize**

**1 point for a third prize**

In the event of a tie on total number of points, then the highest number of first prize awards will determine the winner.

Intended entry will be required. Notice may be made by phone, email or letter and should be received by Wednesday 23th June in order that entry arrangements may be sent to you (this will include any information relating to social distancing PPE etc.)

## **4. Entries for Virtual spring show**

### **General Information:**

**This show is not to be included in any national championship and no prize money will be awarded.**

**The committee have no way of knowing when your photo was taken but we are relying on exhibitor honesty. All photographs should have been taken in May 2021 and be photographs of roses grown by the exhibitor. This is not a photograph competition but clear pictures will help judges to assess the entries more effectively. Photos must not include people, animals or identifiable content.**

Photographs should be taken from the front, side and from above each entry. (3 photo's of each entry except floating blooms when only one from above is required) See example page 10.

Your photographs should be sent to [office@therosesociety.org.uk](mailto:office@therosesociety.org.uk) on or before 12th May 2021.

You must include your name, address, phone number, email address

Class number and variety/varieties for each entry. Date photo taken.

Entries can be made in any container. The roses will be judged including stems and foliage where necessary. Containers will not be judged as part of the exhibit.

### **PRIZE MONEY: Shepperton only**

Prize money will be awarded in accordance with the points won. Each point will carry a monetary value of £1.00 at all shows unless otherwise stated

## **5. Sponsored classes:**

The Rose Society UK website has a Members Only section which will feature information, discounts and articles exclusively for members. An e-magazine with input from the world's most respected rosarians along with articles, pictures and snippets from the membership is issued quarterly to all members.

**At the Spring show** certificates will be awarded to all first second and third placed entries. The best entry will be awarded a certificate 'Best in Show'

**At the Squires Summer show** certificates will be awarded to commemorate:

**The W E Harkness Memorial Trophy** - The Summer Champion South - most points in show

**The Queen Mary Cup** - The Summer Show South 150s Champion - most point in the 150s classes

**The Maurice Gross Rose Bowl** - The Summer Show South Miniature Champion - most points in the miniature and miniflora classes

**Rose Society UK Certificates** will be awarded for the exhibits judged

Best floribunda

Best miniature or miniflora

At all society shows a **Rose Society UK Silver Medal** will be awarded for the Best Exhibit in the Show, this will be judged between all three 'Best' exhibits and any other exhibit that has been awarded a first place card but is not classified hybrid tea, floribunda or miniature/minifloras.

## LARGE AND CLUSTER FLOWERED ROSES

- Class 6 3 large flowered blooms, 1 or more varieties in a vase
- Class 7 3 stems cluster flowered roses, 1 or more varieties in a vase

## MINIATURES AND MINIFLORAS

- Class 8 3 miniflora HT form blooms, 1 or more varieties in a vase
- Class 9 1 FULLY OPEN rose bloom FLOATING in water in a glass or bowl
- Class 10 1 miniature HT form rose bloom at the PERFECT stage FLOATING in water in a glass or bowl
- Class 11 1 miniature FULLY OPEN rose bloom FLOATING in water in a glass or bowl
- Class 12 3 stems miniature HT form blooms, one bloom per stem, 1 or more varieties
- Class 13 3 stems, miniature roses bearing a cluster of blooms, 1 or more varieties
- Class 14 Pot, 1 plant of a bush, climbing or standard miniature rose

- Class 26 Box, 12 blooms specimen large flowered roses, 4 or more varieties
- Class 27 Box, 6 blooms specimen large flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
- Class 28 Bowl,(10") not more than 18 stems. large flowered roses, 6 or more varieties
- Class 29 Bowl, (10") not more than 12 stems of large flowered roses, one or more varieties
