



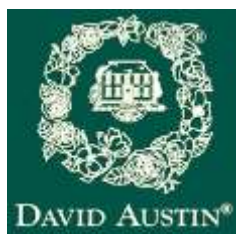

REGULATIONS FOR SHOWS

1

1. This is an OPEN to all show and whilst joining the society is encouraged it is not compulsory
2. For this show only, exhibitors in all classes may receive assistance when staging their roses
3. **Exhibitors MUST inform pauline@therosesociety.org** by Monday 19th July that they are coming to the show. Entries will be taken on the day
4. Exhibitors may only make one entry in each class unless otherwise permitted in the schedule. Spouses or partners living together are considered as one exhibitor
5. Star of the Show classes (at all shows - except virtual shows when only one entry is permitted) -
 - i) in these classes, exhibitors may make any number of entries but only one exhibit of any one variety in each class
 - ii) exhibitors are reminded that in these classes the roses are judged for bloom, stem and foliage
6. All exhibitors and helpers must leave the place in which the competition is taking place at the appointed time. Warnings will be given at intervals prior to the appointed time
7. Exhibits may not be removed from the show tables without prior permission from the Chairman of Show
8. All blooms must have been grown by the exhibitor from bushes that have been in their possession for at least three months
9. To assist judging and to provide information for visitors, all exhibits, should be named. Incorrect, or not naming will not disqualify, providing there is no duplication in classes which ask for distinct varieties. Seedlings, Sports, or unknown varieties should be noted on the variety card provided
10. All rose blooms are to be exhibited free of artificial aids of any kind. The only exception is that Large Flowered booms may have a single wire inserted to hold the flower head erect. All stems must reach water, or water retaining material. Water retaining material in vases, bowls and containers must be kept below the rim of the vessel to allow watering during the show. Only foliage growing on stems is allowed, except where stated in the schedule. Foliage must not be dressed with oils or any other agent
11. All rose blooms exhibited should conform to the standards set out in the current edition of 'Judging and Showing Roses.

12. All exhibits are to be staged for **frontal effect**
13. All receptacles are provided for staging the rose blooms and should be used as stated in the schedule. Exhibits must be staged at the show venue during the time slot allowed in the schedule. The society receptacles must not be taken away for future use
14. The term 'Miniflora' when used in this schedule, describes blooms that are well above average sized miniature rose blooms. They should not be so large as to appear coarse and be markedly smaller than Large Flowered blooms. Stems and foliage should be in proportion to the bloom. All exhibits in classes defined as 'Miniflora' will be judged as defined in 7.5 and 7.6 of Judging and Showing Roses
15. The stems of all miniature cluster flowered roses may bear any type of bloom. It should be noted that all blooms should be shown at the perfect stage for the type of blooms entered. HT type should be half to three quarter open, single, double or semi double blooms should be open and have fresh stamens if visible. All other requirements will be judged and defined in 7.4 of Judging and Showing Roses. Judges should show no preference toward any individual type of bloom. Copies of 'Judging and Showing Roses' is available from the Society website and on the secretary's desk at all shows.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. MISCELLANEOUS:

Entry Fees. No entry fees will be charged for this show

Staging Times are as shown on page 2

Containers. All containers are supplied by the Society. No others may be used.

Exhibitor's cards. May be collected from the Secretary's table during the time the show is open for staging.

Payment of prize money. Prize money awarded at all shows during the year will be paid at the end of the year except classes that are sponsored with vouchers. Sponsored prizes will be available for collection immediately after award ceremonies.

Premier Show medals will be engraved with the winner's name and presented at the first suitable occasion

Awards Presentations will take place at 3.00pm All exhibitors are requested to attend this presentation.

2. POINTS VALUES IN CLASSES FOR SHOW

All classes will carry a points value of;

4 points for a first prize

2 points for a second prize

1 point for a third prize

In the event of a tie on total number of points, then the highest number of first prize awards will determine the winner.

Intended entry will be required. Notice may be made by phone, email or letter and should be received by **MONDAY 19th JULY** in order that entry arrangements may be sent to you (this will include any information relating to social distancing PPE etc.)

- Class 1 Vase (8") 1 stem of large flowered (HT) rose
- Class 2 Vase (8") 1 stem of cluster flowered rose
- Class 3 Vase (7") 1 stem of miniflora, one HT form bloom
- Class 4 Vase (7") 1 stem of miniature, one HT form bloom
- Class 5 Vase (7") 1 stem of cluster flowered miniature blooms -

DEAN HOLE CHALLENGE –Sponsored by David Austin

- Class 6 Vase (8") Cycle of bloom 3 stems of LF roses, one bloom to a stem, 1 variety. One 'bud' stage, one 'perfect' stage, one 'full bloom' stage
- Class 7 Vase (12") not more than 6 stems of large flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
- Class 8 Vase (12") not more than 5 stems cluster flowered roses , 1 or more varieties
- Class 9 Vase (7") not more than 6 stems, miniature roses, one HT form bloom per stem, 1 or more varieties
- Class 10 Vase (7") not more than 5 stems miniature roses, each bearing a cluster of blooms, 1 or more varieties
- Class 11 Vase (8") not more than 6 stems miniflora roses, one HT form bloom per stem, 1 or more varieties

JIM NAYLOR MASTER ROSARIAN CHALLENGE CLASS —Sponsored by Mrs P Naylor

- Class 12 4 vases, 4 single stems of 1 Hybrid Tea bloom (8"), 1 Floribunda cluster (8"), 1 Miniflora HT form bloom (7")and 1 Miniature HT form bloom (7")

OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

- Class 13 Bowl, glass (5"), 1 FULLY OPEN rose bloom FLOATING in water
- Class 14 Dish, glass, Collage of floating blooms in gel (dish & gel provided)
- Class 15 Large picture frame, 1 bloom large flowered rose, HT form bloom at perfect stage. Additional rose foliage may be added

- Class 16 Large picture frame, a bouquet of 2 or more rose blooms displayed for artistic effect.

Additional rose foliage may be added

- Class 17 Vase (8") 1 spray or stem of any type of rose, to be judged purely for scent. Exhibitors may make multiple, different variety entries SEE GENERAL INFO 6
- Class 18 Box (round), 6 open blooms, any type of rose other than miniature, four or more varieties
- Class 19 Vase 12" 5 stems/sprays of modern shrub blooms should be fully double, David Austin / Renaissance / New English type, 1 or more varieties
- Class 20 Box, 6 blooms specimen large flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
- Class 21 Bowl, (10") not more than 12 stems of large flowered roses, one or more varieties
- Class 22 Three vases (12") not more than 3 stems of large flowered roses in each, a distinct variety in each vase
- Class 23 Vase (8") 3 stems of large flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
- Class 24 Three vases (12") not more than 3 stems of cluster flowered roses in each, a distinct variety in each vase
- Class 25 Bowl (10") not more than 12 stems cluster flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
- Class 26 Vase (12") 3 stems cluster flowered roses, 1 or more varieties

MINIATURE / MINIFLORA ROSE CHAMPIONSHIP

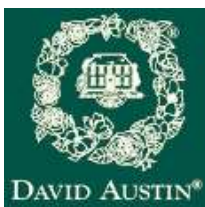
- Class 27 Box, 6 HT form miniature blooms, 1 or more varieties
- Class 28 Straight glass, 1 miniature HT form rose bloom at the PERFECT stage, FLOATING in water
- Class 29 Curved glass, 1 miniature FULLY OPEN rose bloom FLOATING in water
- Class 30 Bowl (5") not more than 12 stems, one miniature HT form bloom per stem, 1 or more varieties
- Class 31 Small picture frame, one HT form MINIATURE bloom at perfect stage
Additional rose foliage may be added
- Class 32 Medium picture frame, one HT form miniflora bloom at perfect stage
Additional rose foliage may be added
- Class 33 Vase (7") 3 stems miniature roses, one HT form bloom per stem, 1 or more varieties
- Class 34 Bowl, (5"), any number of stems, miniature roses bearing a cluster of blooms, 1 or more varieties. Max width 18ins
- Class 35 Palette, 7 fully open stage miniature blooms, four or more varieties
- Class 36 Vase (7") 3 stems miniature roses, each bearing a cluster of blooms, 1 or more varieties
- Class 37 Vase (7"), Cycle of bloom, 3 stems of miniature HT blooms, one bloom to a stem. One at 'bud' stage, One at 'perfect stage', One at 'full bloom' stage
- Class 38 Vase (8"), Cycle of bloom, 3 stems of miniflora HT blooms, one bloom to a stem. One at 'bud' stage, One at 'perfect stage', One at 'full bloom' stage
- Class 39 Box, 6 miniflora roses, HT form blooms, 1 or more varieties
- Class 40 Vase (8") 3 stems miniflora roses, one HT form bloom per stem, 1 or more varieties

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES for GROWERS OF 150 or FEWER BUSHES

- Class 41 Box, 6 specimen blooms, 1 or more varieties
Class 42 Vase (12") 6 stems large flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
Class 43 Vase (8") 3 stems large flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
Class 44 Bowl (7") not more than 7 stems cluster flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
Class 45 Vase (12") 5 stems cluster flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
Class 46 Vase (8") 3 stems cluster flowered roses, 1 or more varieties
